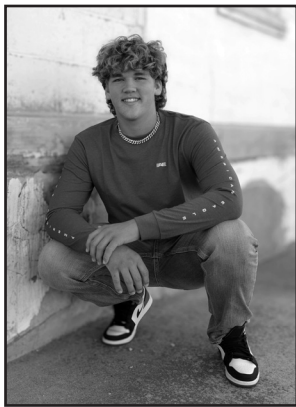

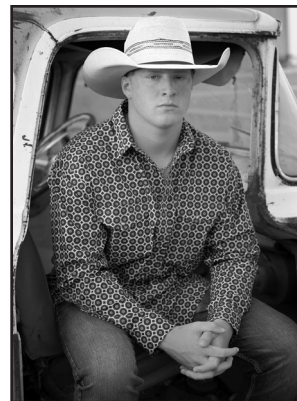
Kick the same year. Kennedy partook in track for her sophomore year as well, while in both 11th and 12th grade, she was in golf.
