Royals Football Advances

The 2024 football playoffs began on October 25 with the MMCRU Royals hosting the Logan-Magnolia Panthers. The host team routed their guests.

The Royals scored put a touchdown and a point after on the board in the first quarter. They scored double digits in each of the next 3 quarters. Defensively, the Royals held their opponents to 1 TD and PAT in each of the 2nd and 4th quarter. The final was 47-14. The Royals advance to the second round at West Hancock Eagles. The game is Friday November 1 at 7:00pm.

Sophomore quarterback Eli Harpenau attempted 12 passes, completing 9 and gaining 156 yards and 2 TDs. Harpenau also rushed 47 yards with 1 TD.

Junior Brayson Mulder advanced the ball 183 yards from 14 carries. He grabbed 6 throws and put 2 TDs on the board.

Senior Michael Peterson succeeded in 3 targets gaining 98 yards and 1 TD.

Junior Parker Glassmaker is credited with 10 tackles. Two were for loss and another for loss tackle is shared. It was 1 of 6 sacks.

The Royals intercepted one of the 33 Panthers throws and returned it for 26 yards. Two of their throws put them on the board. They were held to 175 yards through the air. The Panthers ran the ball 33 times gaining 96 rushing yards and gave away a fumble. The Royals carried 28 times gaining 296 yards.

Royals' defense was strong. They own 58 tackles against the Panthers' 35.

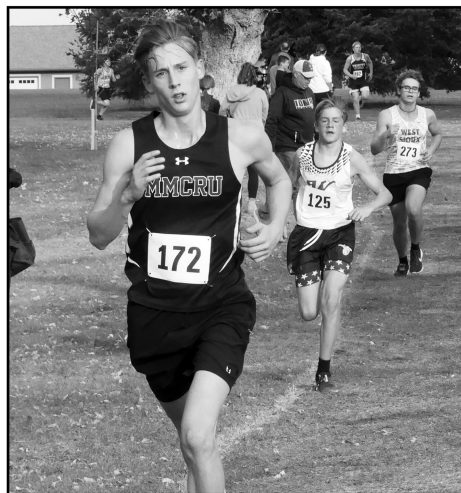
